### Action Plan for the Energy Partnership 2022/2023

In May 2022, the Steering Group Co-Chairs endorsed an Action Plan for the Energy Partnership for the following 12 months, with a focus on hydrogen, critical minerals, energy security, and just transition.

- Hydrogen cooperation focus: maritime shipping of hydrogen and its derivatives, standard-setting and certification, B2B networking, and industry decarbonisation.
- Critical minerals cooperation focus: advancing bilateral trade and investment partnerships, collaborate on R&D and advance ESG standards in supply chains
